Samuel - Great story, servant of God, prophet

Saul - Israel's first king

Israel becoming stabilized, united; dealing with enemies

Saul's failings – offered sacrifice himself; did not completely destroy Amalekites God rejects Saul as king (slide)

* 1 Samuel 13:13 - 14 (p. 142)

Where we are - Chapter 11

God sends Samuel to Jesse, meets his sons

State of heart is extremely important to God – "A man after His own heart" Samuel anoints David (slide) * **Acts 13:22**

David shows his heart (slide) as his life and the story unfolds

Battling Goliath (slide)

The story...

David's response and actions * 1 Samuel 17:45 - 47 (p. 149)

David knew the battle was the LORD's (shows his heart)

Fill-in story elements:

Jonathan and David great friends

Saul displeased with David "Saul...thousands, David...tens of thousands"

Tries to kill David with spear

David flees, gathers loyal following (600 men)

Saul pursues David

Sparing Saul's life (slide)

The story...

David's answer and actions * 1 Samuel 24:6 - 7 (p. 143)

David would not kill the LORD's anointed (shows his heart)

Fill-in story elements:

David actually spares Saul a second time

David's fleeing takes him into Philistine territory

Israel battles the Philistines and Saul (and Jonathan) are killed

David crowned king over Judah

Struggle with the house of Saul

David king over all Israel (7 years later)

• Bringing up the Ark (of the Covenant) (slide)

The story...

David's actions * 2 Samuel 6:13 - 15 (p. 147)

David understood who God is (shows his heart)

(respect, honor, devotion, celebration, awe, obedience, reverence...)

Fill-in story elements:

David settled

Wanting to build the Temple (slide)

The story...

David's motivation * 2 Samuel 7:2 (p. 158)

David understood his place and wanted to honor God (shows his heart)

Wrap up story elements:

God tells David he will not be the one to build Temple But David's kingdom will be established forever

Recap 4 examples of David showing he is a "man after God's own heart"

What do we take from David's example? We should strive to have a heart like his Heart Check: What can you do to cultivate a heart like David's? (slide)
